

What is SAX-O-PHLM?

For the last twenty years I have spent my professional career performing on Broadway, with prominent symphony orchestras such as the Philadelphia, Los Angeles and Metropolitan Opera Orchestras, and recording major motion pictures. In 2006, I created a fully scripted, multimedia, vaudeville concert featuring popular music of the 1920's, entitled SAX-O-PHILM: Sounds & Sights of the 20's.

This show features myself on saxophones along with harp, piano, female dancer/vocalist and the legendary Vince Giordano on banjo, vocals and bass. I have performed this specific concert in restored vaudeville theaters, concert series and universities from Bangkok to Connecticut. Along with world-class performers, the show features silent movies and interesting anecdotes of the period to round out this special event.

In 2019, I envisioned SAX-O-PHILM on a larger scale, with full symphony orchestra arrangements. These orchestral arrangements were premiered with the Broadway Chamber Players in June of 2019 to a sold out audience and was a huge success. I feel this is the starship of SAX-O-PHILM and is even more engaging. SAX-O-PHILM is meant for audiences of all ages, from 9 to 94!

Chad Smith Saxophone & Woodwind Artist

Chad is sought after as a Broadway, recording artist, and concert performer from New York to Los Angeles. He has been a member of the Broadway orchestras of Wicked, Legally Blonde, Follies, Christmas Story: The Musical, and the Radio City Christmas Spectacular.

He has performed with many prestigious orchestras, including the Philadelphia Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, Mostly Mozart Festival, American Ballet Theatre, New York City Ballet, New York Pops, American Symphony, New Jersey Symphony, and the Albany Symphony.

Chad has shared the stage with Paquito D'Rivera, Vince Giordano, Tony Bennett, Johnny Mathis, Aretha Franklin, Ray Charles, John Pizzarelli, The Temptations, Arturo Sandoval, Lady Gaga, Bernadette Peters, and Audra McDonald.

His movie credits include Star Wars: The Last Jedi, Secret Life Of Pets 2, Little, The Informant!, Ted 2, Extremely Close and Incredibly Loud, I Saw the Light, and Monsters University. Mr. Smith has been featured on television in Legally Blonde on MTV, The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, Grease on Fox, The Wiz and Hairspray on NBC, the Tony Awards on CBS, and the Academy Awards on ABC. You can also hear Chad on the TV shows Family Guy, American Dad, Crazy Ex-Girlfriend, The Flash, Lucifer, Smash, The Simpsons, and Fosse/Verdon.

Chad has created Sax-O-Philm: Sounds and Sight's of the 20's. Sax-O-Philm highlights the music of sax pioneer Rudy Wiedoeft accompanied by piano, harp and silent films, which he premiered at the 15th World Saxophone Congress in Bangkok. This past summer, Sax-O-Philm grew to a fully-orchestrated show premiered by Chad and the Broadway Chamber Players. 

Wendi Bergamini just completed the Broadway run of the hit revival of Evita starring Ricky Martin. She was also recently seen on Broadway in the revival of Promises, Promises directed & choreographed by the renowned Rob Ashford, and at Lincoln Center in the breathtaking revival of South Pacific under the direction of Bartlett Sher & Christopher Gattelli.

Her national tours include The Light in the Piazza (Franca, 1st National), Guys & Dolls, Evita (25th Anniversary tour, directed by Hal Prince), and Cats (Jellylorum) and regional credits include Finian's Rainbow (Westport Country Playhouse), The Baker's Wife (Goodspeed Opera House, dir. Dalton Ridenhour Piano

Dalton Ridenhour, a native of St. James, Missouri, began musical training at the age of eight. He quickly developed an interest in Ragtime and was soon a regular featured performer at The Scott Joplin Ragtime Festival, The West Coast Ragtime Festival and various other ragtime festivals and events in the US and Canada. In addition to festival performances during his formative years, Dalton

was a member of of the 2000 Grammy All-American High School Jazz Ensemble, Betty Carter's Jazz Ahead and The Interlochen Arts Camp.

Dalton furthered his education at the Berklee College of Music and The Eastman School of Music where he studied with many jazz greats including Harold Danko, Joanne Brackeen, Danilo Perez, Joe Lovano and Hal Crook. He received an Eastman graduate assistantship award that gave him the opportunity to teach undergraduate courses at the Eastman School and the University of Rochester. Dalton has also received a Downbeat Student Music Award for Oustanding Soloist in the college division and Eastman's Shirmer Prize award for jazz performance.

Currently, Dalton resides in New York City where he performs with various groups including The Bria Skonberg Quintet, Svetlana and The Delancey Five, Dan Levinson's Roof Garden Jazz Band, Mona's Hot Four and Goodbye Picasso. He continues as a featured performer at ragtime and early jazz festivals, and recently released his first solo album, "Eccentricity," on the Rivermont Records label.

An orchestra harpist, chamber musician, recording artist, and soloist, Lynette Wardle enjoys a varied and rewarding performance career.
